Doug Fishbone is an American artist based in London. His work often uses satire and humour within film, performance and installation to examine consumer culture and the mass media in a critical and disarming way and to investigate the relativity of perception and understanding between different conceptual frameworks and contexts. Doug Fishbone's works place the viewer in an awkward position where we are forced to explore our interpretative resources. In his video and performance practice, the artist ransacked the internet – mostly Google Image Search – to illustrate and undermine his arresting, repulsive and undeniably amusing monologues on contemporary media and our cultural, social and political (sub)life.

He earned an MA in Fine Art at Goldsmiths College in 2003 and was awarded the Beck's Futures Prize for Student Film and Video in 2004. He is perhaps best known for his project 30,000 Bananas – a huge mountain of ripe bananas installed in the middle of London's Trafalgar Square and later given away free to the audience – in October 2004. Fishbone's video and performance work was included in the last year's British Art Show 6, a national touring exhibition held every five years to feature the best in contemporary British art. He had his first major solo project at Gimpel Fils in London in October of 2006, and performed at London's Hayward Gallery in February of 2007. Upcoming projects include a live performance at the ICA in London in July of 2007, as well as group exhibitions in Switzerland, Japan and Korea. He was recently voted one of the Future Greats of the art world in the annual survey of Art Review magazine. Fishbone was born in New York City in 1969.

Communism was specially selected for this Collection to be shown in the inaugural exhibition opening M o m e n t u m / Berlin in Kunstquartier Bethanien, a historic building situated on the very path of the Berlin Wall.
