

SARAH LÜDEMANN

Sarah Lüdemann was born 1981 in Cologne, Germany and is currently living and working in Berlin. Receiving the prestigious South Square Trust Award Lüdemann started her MA in Fine Art at Central Saint Martins, London in 2010, and graduated with Distinction in September 2011. Her first degree was a BA (Hons) teaching degree with the subjects Fine Art and English as a Foreign Language at Universität zu Köln, where she was taught a.o. by Beuys' student Dr. Peter Rech. Between 2005 and 2012 Sarah Lüdemann lived and worked in Norway, Italy, England, The Netherlands and Germany. During her stay in Cambridge and Amsterdam, she co-founded and directed the two exhibition projects Cambridge Open Art Space and Expo ISBN and curated various conjuncted exhibitions. In 2010 Lüdemann was selected for an influential residency with Mona Hatoum in Santander Spain, and in March 2013 she was invited to give several lectures about her work at various universities in the USA. Lüdemann has exhibited widely internationally, including at the 4th Cairo Video Festival, Goethe Institute Cairo, Egypt in 2010, New York Art Book Fair, MoMa PS1, New York, USA, and The Piracy Project, SALT's library, Garanti bank, Istanbul, Turkey in 2011, About face, Momentum | Berlin, Berlin, Germany in 2012, and First they took New York, then they took Berlin, Present Company, New York, USA in 2013.

"As a child I would sit and watch the washing machine spin for hours, and then even the static on TV. Years later I read a text by Paul Virilio about George Perec asking how we must look in order to see properly, in order to penetrate the world; and that the most extraordinary things are concealed by what is visible, hidden in the obvious. I look at this complexity that lies within simplicity; I want to know what's underneath."

Repetition and the act of looking are strong features of Sarah Lüdemann's work and contemplation. Her non-narrative video installations or performances can take an epic form and repeat a single gesture, movement or action until it looses its original purpose and gains a new meaning that lies beneath. Often the viewer seems to be left with nothing much to see, unless they are prepared to look again and look for a bit longer. Somehow patterns are formed in Lüdemann's work that mirror and question psychological states, concepts of self, social and gender roles, religious beliefs and rituals and modes of perception and (re)presentation. Lüdemann's works are often quiet, but persistant, gentle, but forceful. She establishes herself and her work in the space. She is there; quietly and continuously questioning systems and remarking on power structures; investigating into communication, language, words, gestures, philosophies or political and social ideologies. Though conceptual, all of Lüdemann's works are sensual experiences, which she wants the viewer to be totally immersed in.
