MOMENTUM's program is composed of local and international Exhibitions, Artist and Curator Residencies, Video Art in Public Space Initiatives, a Performance Archive, an Education Archive, and a growing Collection. Positioned as both a local and global platform, MOMENTUM serves as a bridge joining professional art communities, irrespective of institutional and national borders. MOMENTUM is dedicated to providing a platform for exceptional artists with a program focused on the growing diversity and relevance of time-based practices, continuously seeks innovative answers to the question 'What is time-based art?'.







The MOMENTUM Residency is dedicated to artistic research into time and temporality in visual language.

Open to artists working in a variety of media and practices, MOMENTUM AiR is a process-based residency designed to facilitate research as much as production of new work, while providing a framework for building professional networks and cooperations within Berlin's thriving art community.

By enabling Research, Creation, Discussion, Exchange and Exhibition, MOMENTUM AiR provides a platform and a network in which artists and curators can develop their practice, further their knowledge, innovate and experiment, within a respected international professional framework.










MOMENTUM AiR hosts

Location and facilities



Within walking distance of the gallery district, Mitte, and extremely convenient for public transport to the rest of the city, MOMENTUM AiR presents a wonderful opportunity to experience the 'Art Capital of Europe' in comfort and style. The apartment is fully furnished, has wireless internet, and houses a private art library. The 4 rooms plus two bathrooms and kitchen allow for 3 artists/curators/couples to occupy the Residency concurrently.

The Residency offers 3 options of accommodation: a large double room with en-suite bathroom, a large double room with shared bathroom, and a small single room with shared bathroom. All Residents share a living/dining room, kitchen, and balcony.

The Residency space may also be used for Kunst Salons and other events to introduce the AiR Residents to the Berlin art community. Furthermore, artists and curators undertaking the AiR program have access to the facilities and support of MOMENTUM and our partner institutions.

Situated in Berlin, the 'City of Artists', the MOMENTUM Residency is located in a beautiful residential apartment in the lovely neighborhood of Prenzlauerberg.











The MOMENTUM Gallery and office is located in the historic Kunstquartier Bethanien Art Center, at the heart of the gallery district of Kreuzberg.



AiR Residents have access to all of the facilities in the building, including a media lab, film and sound studio, a printing workshop featuring every form of print media, dance studios, theater and music schools, and other facilities. When available between Gallery exhibitions, the MOMENTUM space may be used as a shared studio and exhibition space. If additional studio space is required, MOMENTUM will assist artists in locating studio facilities. The facilities listed above all incur additional costs. as detailed in the following section.





Other Facilities and Partners

BBK Sound & Media Workshop



The publically funded media workshop opened in 2009 and offers infrastructure and skill-building for fine artists creating media art works. The workshop is available for any artist to use. Equipment includes five differently equipt digital workspaces (Mac) and a Greenbox for audio and video recordings as well as post-pro duction. Analogue technologies are also available. 2D and 3D animation as well as interactive media projects can be realised in the workshop.

BBK Printmakers' Workshop



was, using public means, developed in 1973 in Bethanien to be open to all artists. It is the most extensive, non-commercial artistic printmakers' workshop worldwide. All known printing techniques such as screen-printing, offset print, etching, woodcutting, lithography and photography can be performed here, as well as combinations of these. Papermaking, bookbinding, catalogue printing, book printing, video and digital technology are also available. The BBK Berlin printmakers' workshop is open to all artists. Daily use of the workshop costs Euro 8. Use of the computer department costs Euro 10 per day. Video-cutting costs €21 per day. A price-list for material and additional services can be made available on request at the appropriate department.

ICI Berlin Institute for Cultural Inquiry



The ICI Berlin Institute for Cultural Inquiry is an independent centre for research and culture dedicated to exploring how diverse cultures can be brought into productive rather than pernicious confrontation. It takes 'culture' in a broad sense to include cultures associated with different identities (such as age, class, ethnicity, gender, nationality, race, religion, sexuality), spaces (such as city, internet, work) or discourses (such as art, economics, law, media, politics, science).

Please scroll down for a breakdown of costs. MOMENTUM is a non-profit institution and will provide materials for funding applications by invited AiRs, but cannot offer any funding or maintenance support. Applicants are advised to concurrently apply to a variety of funding bodies.

The Cost of the AiR Residency covers the accommodation, MOMENTUM programming and guidance, but excludes travel expenses, cost of living, insurance, material costs, studio space, fabrication or exhibition. An indicative budget of these costs can be supplied upon request.



MOMENTUM AiR accepts applications on an ongoing basis. There are no application deadlines.



We welcome applications by artists and curators working in all media and practices, though the proposed project must address the subject of time and temporality in visual language.
